

M20 Summit programme

The M20 Summit is a two-day international conference running on the sidelines of the G20 programme in South Africa. The Summit focus is on the role of media and journalism to foster information integrity as a cornerstone for human rights, effective governance, international cooperation and public trust needed for social and economic development.

The conference amplifies voices from emerging G20 economies, African and other media stakeholders in exploring actionable proposals that align with the priorities of the G20 and unique challenges faced by developing nations.

The Summit topics cover the issues raised in the M20 policy briefs, and other matters related to the role of media and information integrity in the G20.
